WORKS UPDATE FOR MARCH

- Exploration works commenced to collate information regarding the existing substructure in both Atlantic & Lytham House.
- Scaffolding to Lytham House (all four elevations) have been complete, in anticipation for façade retention.
- Structural strengthening works to the corners of Lytham House & chimneys are 90% complete.
- Northern façade of Atlantic House has been tidied up and a clean cut has been created in anticipation for the superstructure.

UPCOMING WORKS FOR APRIL

- Contiguous piling wall to the northern boundary with Douro Place, aiming to start w/c 15/04/24. MYCO will confirm the precise commencement date for this activity a week in advance.
- MYCO are aiming to start demolition of the remaining eastern façade to Atlantic House w/c 29/04/24. MYCO will confirm the precise commencement date for this activity a week in advance.
- Underpinning of the existing foundations to both Atlantic & Lytham House will commence.
- Infill brick/blockwork to the eastern façade of Lytham House will commence post demolition of the 'link building'.
- Civils works due to start 04/04/24 for our temporary builder's supply (water). This will be within our site hoarding and adjacent to St. Albans Grove.
