
## Modal Share & Travel Survey

The school promotes walking, cycling, and scooting, offering storage for bikes and scooters. Staff monitor traffic daily, and students receive pedestrian, scooter, and cycle training. Year 6 students are encouraged to travel independently, with parental permission, focusing on safe travel during Lent Term, including a TfL Citizens session. A school minibus service is available based on demand.

Thomas's Kensington is part of the TfL Travel for Life programme, aiming to reduce car use, improve road safety, and promote health. The school has a GOLD accreditation, reflecting its success in meeting these goals since joining in 2013. A School Travel Co-ordinator oversees the School Travel Plan.

RBKC has requested for the school to organise a travel survey of parents (using suitable techniques to achieve a high response rate).

As such, we will hold a school led practice survey this September and a TRICS certified survey in November.




## **Travel Plan Options**

#### **OPTION A - Locations 1 and 2 with School Street AM and PM**



Option A prohibits parent car trips on St Albans Grove with the implementation of a school street during the hours of drop off and pick up (school minibuses and St Albans Grove residents (12-32A) will be exempt). For morning dropoffs, staff would supervise pupils being dropped off at two designated locations, where parents remain in their vehicles, enforcing a "Stop and Drop" policy. In the afternoon, a "Park and Stride" approach is proposed. Parents must find a parking space in the local area and walk to the school to pick up their child/children.

Option A discourages private car use while acknowledging that some parents may still choose to drive their children to school. However, the proposed vehicle routing plan will impact local streets, including Eldon Road, where residential driveways may be affected by dropoff activity, causing inconvenience





for residents, and in the afternoons, cars may circulate through neighbouring streets in search of parking spaces.

## **Travel Plan Options**

#### **OPTION B – AM Drop-off on St Albans Grove and PM School Street**



This option proposes a "Stop and Drop" system to operate for morning drop-offs. Staff will be on hand to assist children entering the school, whilst parents remain in their vehicles. Vehicles will access the school by driving south on Victoria Road, then turning right onto 1 St Albans Grove to drop off their child, followed by being routed down Stanford Road and Cottesmore Gardens, before turning left back onto Victoria Road.

Parents will need to drive away from the drop off point immediately after leaving their child at the school to ensure a continuous flow of traffic. Additionally, there is a risk of congestion on St Albans Grove in the mornings as non-school vehicles may attempt to drive eastbound while school drop-off traffic moves westbound, leading to potential conflicts.



efforts to promote a shift towards more sustainable travel options, as it facilitates easy vehicle dropoffs. However, fewer cars will be circulating the area looking for parking spaces.

A "Park and Stride" approach is suggested for the afternoon. The School Street would restrict vehicle access along St Albans Grove during set times in the afternoon (residents and school minibuses will be exempt). A school street encourages active travel, yet cars will be circulating neighbouring streets looking for parking spaces.



## **Travel Plan Options**

### **OPTION C - School Street AM and PM with no Locations 1 and 2**



The strategy promotes active travel and encourages changes in travel behaviour as Thomas's will not be facilitating vehicle drop-offs. Parent car trips will be prohibited from driving on St Albans Grove.

School minibuses will be allowed to access St Albans Grove and will be exempt from School Street restrictions, alongside residents living on the restricted section of the road.

If parents do choose to drive to the school, there are circa 165 free parking spaces in the morning (within a 400m walk, as drop-off occurs before the Controlled Parking Zone starts at 08:30). Meanwhile, for pick-up (15:00-16:30), 180 free spaces are available, and 84% of students have borough-wide resident parking permits. Additional paid parking options are also available for non RBKC residents.



This option does not involve vehicle traffic being managed by Thomas's staff, and cars will be circulating the neighbouring streets looking for parking spaces.

## **Deliveries & Servicing**

The proposed Delivery and Servicing Management Plan (DSMP) supports sustainable development, following TfL's guidelines. Its key objectives are to ensure safe, efficient, and environmentally friendly deliveries and waste removal, reduce and consolidate deliveries during peak times, improve delivery reliability, lower operational costs, and minimise freight impact on residents and the environment. The school monitor and review the DSMP at defined regular intervals to identify what works well and what can be improved upon.

Delivery and servicing activities have long taken place on the street for the existing school buildings. The new school, however, consolidates these operations at a single location designed for direct on-site delivery access via St Albans Grove. Security staff will manage gated access to ensure no vehicle waiting on the street.

Key deliveries include catering, chemicals, laundry, maintenance, and postal services.

Both the catering provider and the waste supplier are current suppliers that drop off at Thomas's Kensington and they understand the need to mitigate disruption to our neighbours as much as possible.

Delivery vehicles up to 7.5 tonnes can access the site, with most vehicles expected to be smaller.

Catering deliveries are scheduled with Harrison Catering, using transit-sized vans, and larger Panel vans for less frequent deliveries.

Chemical and laundry deliveries occur weekly or bi-weekly.


Postal and parcel deliveries will utilise existing street facilities.

**Waste collection**, handled by First Mile, will reduce to weekly pickups, with bins prepared by school staff.

Emergency maintenance or ambulances will use the allocated bay at the school as required. The caretaker will be informed ahead of arrival by Thomas's staff members.

Any bulky deliveries to the site will need to be pre-arranged. The delivery time and duration will be agreed in advance with the site management team to minimise the impact upon the routine daily servicing requirements of the development and other occupiers.



# Minibuses & Parking

- When the vehicles are not in use, they will be parked in the local area, and they will not be left unattended.
- We avoid using any hired buses and utilise our trained inhouse drivers.
- No onsite parking is allowed other than for the minibuses one parking space for 'blue badge' holders.
- Thomas's has a dedicated transport manager and admin support team to coordinate all travel to and from the school.
- The home to school minibus route for next year is a single route and drops in the morning only arriving circa 08:20. There is no home run in the afternoons (parents pick up pupils themselves in the afternoons).
